

Councilman Whalen read the monthly Treasurer's Report submitted by Shelley Strehle. It was accepted by a motion of Councilman Krause, seconded by Councilwoman Martz with all Council voting aye.

Committee Reports

Councilman DePrince read the monthly police report which was in the dropbox for review.

Councilman Whalen stated transfers could begin at the next meeting. The planning of the 2017 budget has begun. The tax sale took place with only vacant lots not being bid on which became municipal liens.

Councilwoman Bonamassa stated John Seville from the JIF completed a site visit with no issues reported. Preparation for the holidays has begun by DPW. The doors at the rec center are planned to be replaced in the front of the building and round tables will be purchased.

Councilwoman Martz stated her reports are in the dropbox and the Housing Inspector has completed Coventry Apartments and Regency Court. The rabies clinic will take place on November 5. The planning board has an application for a fence in the front yard.

Councilman Krause thanked everyone for their help for the Halloween Parade. There was no hay ride due to the rain. The Rec Committee made about \$100. with the sale of hot dogs and water. There were two scare crows submitted for the contest. The house decorating contest winners have been chosen and will be posted online. Upcoming events are being planned.

The Mayor thanked the DPW for their help with the Halloween Parade.

The Engineer reported he received clarification from NJDOT regarding the 2016 DOT funding which is ready to go, and the 2017 funding will not be ready until the spring.

The Solicitor spoke about a property which was in court for property maintenance and the pickle ball lease was reviewed.

Ed Hoban inquired about speed bumps. Councilman DePrince explained there is a priority listing for future installation of bumps. He also stated he only had two months left of his tenure as President of the Fire Company and thanked everyone for their cooperation during the year.

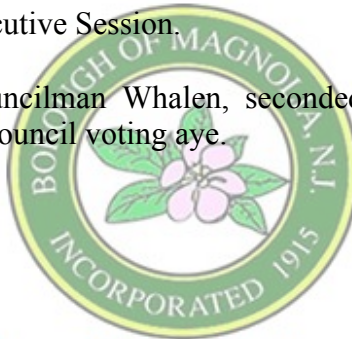
A resident of 613 Jackson spoke about his desire to also have chickens at his home. He wanted to be part of the pilot program.
