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COMMITTEE REPORTS:

PUBLIC SAFETY & COMPLIANCE –Councilman DePrince reported that all three Public Safety entities has been awarded the Best of the South Jersey 2018 with the Courier Post. This will be officially announced in a publication.

FINANCE & ADMINISTRATION – Councilman Whalen thanked everyone for their cooperation with the preparation and adoption of the 2018 budget. He reminded everyone to keep a watch on your spending at the same time be sure that your departments have what they need.

PUBLIC WORKS & TECHNOLOGY – Councilwoman Bonamassa thanked Jay and staff at the Department of Public Works for the work that was done at the softball field for opening day.

PLANNING/ZONING, CODES, LICENSING & STREET LIGHTING – Councilwoman Martz advised that the Green Garden and Regency apartment complexes are up for sale. Coventry Place currently has an 85% failure rate on the annual inspections. Royal Farms will be attending the April 25, Planning/Zoning Board Meeting for the signage.

PUBLIC EVENTS – Councilman Krause, thanked Jay for the work that was completed for opening day for Magnolia Little League. The Miss Magnolia pageant will be held on April 28th, 2018. Movies night at Albertson Park is scheduled for May 12, 2017. Vince Pappale will be present and will be donating \$5.00 for every book that he sells at the event. Youth in Government day is set for May 17, 2018. The Memorial Day parade is being planned, and we are hoping for a large parade. July 4th, 2018 festivities are also in the planning stages, vendor letters will be going out shortly. The parade will run from 10 am until 2 pm. National night out is also in its planning stages.

FACILITIES & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT – Councilman Saxton advised that a contractor will be coming out on Monday to meet with the Business Administrator and Public Works supervisor. He further discussed that budget estimated on the Municipal Building Roof replacement have been received. He also discussed taking some paver blocks that are not being used at the recreation center and make a box around the Borough sign for plantings and such for some beautification of Borough Hall. National Night out is currently in the planning stages.

MAYOR reported that she had attended the renaming of Berean Baptist Church to Milestone Church. Pastor Bill made it known that he attended the Magnolia Little League opening day and took note that there was issues with the speaker system and will be making a donation to the Little League to go towards a replacement. She further reported that she had gone to a medical marijuana facility in Baltimore. There will be a lot of work that will need to take place should recreational use of marijuana come to fruition. She also advised that there is a grant available for a plug in station for electric vehicles. The station itself would be free however, the installation would be a cost that the Borough would incur. Before we go ahead and apply we should discuss if there is a need and the best location for placement.

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ENGINEER REPORT – Mark Bashore, advised Mayor and Council that Steve Bach, will be attending our next council meeting to present the Redevelopment Area along the White Horse Pike.

He further discussed that he had a preconstruction meeting in regard to the Albertson park lighting. The contractor is well aware that this is an active park and site safety is a big concern. Contractor is anticipating that a majority of the work will be completed by late April beginning of May.

A question arose in regard to a handicapped parking space at Little League. The location of the spot was approved to be in that location. To repair/replace or relocate the spot could either be a 3 quote or could be included with another bid. Should we include in another bid it would most likely be cost effective.

On Monday, during the rain storm he received a call from the Acting Clerk in regard to a complaint received from a resident at 211 E. Monroe Ave. The residents' complaint is that he believes that Royal Farms basin is not working properly and is causing water in his basement. An inspection was performed and everything seems to be working properly and has been constructed according to the approved plan.

A discussion took place in regard to the roof estimates, options and warranty information. It was determined that option 2 would be our best option. Mark will prepare a spec package accordingly so we can move forward with the roof replacement.

SOLICITOR REPORT – John Moustakis, Esq. is present for Dan Long, Esq. who had an issue that required his attention. Mr. Moustakis advised at this time there is nothing to report.

Chief Paul Wolf, Magnolia Fire Department; expressed his concern in regard to a safety plan during snow storms. The fire department needs to be able to get apparatus in an out with the snow. They are seeking to acquire a snow plan and have installed on an existing vehicle. The approximate cost is \$4,500.00. If this is not feasible they are requesting additional help in keeping the snow cleared on the property and driveway.

There was discussion regarding the Bingo applications that have been submitted that have been denied and returned from Legalized Games of Chance. LGCCC has returned 2 applications for Bingo because they cannot be held at the Community Center because it is a government owned building and does not have a renters' license. There is an annual fee along with a fee per use that the Borough would be required to pay to LGCCC. A further review will need to be completed prior to a decision being made. Currently, there are no "Bingo" locations within the Borough.
