Permits are required for most home improvements. The Borough has a "No Fee" permit for most concrete work.

Certificate of Occupancies (fee \$46.00) need to be obtained once you list your home for sale or change a tenant in a rental property. Should you sell to someone with school age children and do not obtain a certificate of occupancy the children will be unable to attend either Magnolia Public or Sterling High School until one is obtained.


PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

DOG AND CAT LICENSING

Remember there is an Ordinance prohibiting more than 2 dogs and/or 2 cats per household. Should you have more than the allowed number, please do not replace a pet should it leave you. Licensing is required for dogs and cats alike. Renewal for licensing is due by the end of January each year. Shortly we will be conducting an animal census throughout the Borough.

While many of us do not like it, paying taxes is a responsibility that we all share; and living in a small community heightens this responsibility. When a neighbor or friend neglects this responsibility, it becomes an even greater impact on



everyone else. Be fair to your neighbors and friends by keeping current with all of your payments. In addition, please be assured that this borough council continues to explore all economical options to minimize the burden of property taxes on every homeowner. Please continue to direct your concerns of escalating property taxes, as we also continue to do, to your State representatives in Trenton. Your concerns can also be directed to me via the Borough website at <u>www.magnolia-nj.org</u> and I will forward them on behalf of all our residents.



HOW IS THE TAX RATE ESTABLISHED?

The tax rate is expressed in thousandths of a dollar. A tax rate of \$4.636 is equivalent to \$46.36 in taxes per \$1,000 of net assessed value, which means

an owner of a property assessed at \$100,000 paid \$4,636 in property taxes in 2005. The overall tax rate is calculated and set by the County of Camden, annually, based on county, municipal, local school, and regional school needs. Also, the county states that we must revaluate all municipal property every ten years. Since our last valuation occurred in 1993 (14 years ago), we have begun the process of revaluating all property with anticipation for completion in 2007 and adoption in 2008.

For those property taxes in the arrears, the Borough of Magnolia Tax Sale is set for June 22 @ 10:00 a.m. If you have any questions or concerns please contact our CFO/Tax Collector at 783-1520 x 112.
