CITIZENS URGED TO VOTE IN APRIL 20 SCHOOL ELECTION

The Magnolia Board of Education and the Superintendent, Warren L. Pross, remind residents to vote in the 2010 Annual School Election on Tuesday, April 20, 2010. The election will be held as it was last year at the Magnolia Community Center, between the hours of 2:00pm and 9:00pm.

The annual election process provides the citizens of the borough of Magnolia with the opportunity of electing the individuals who sit on the local school board. The members of the school board set policy in a number of areas including: fiscal responsibility, the school program, and the use by outside organizations of the school facilities. These policies are guides for the administration and staff in managing the educational program.

In addition, the Board of Education negotiates the contracts of the district employees including the support staff, teachers, and administrators.

Likewise, the school board also approves the local district's proposed budget for presentation to the voters. Voters then cast their vote on the proposed budget.

As you may know, Governor Christie and members of his Committee on Education have released information regarding the money to be allocated to school districts for education.

While we do not as of yet have state aid figures, it is apparent that we should anticipate a cut in our state aid. As we prepare the budget for 2010/2011, we are looking for all possible areas to cut costs and lower expenditures during these difficult financial times. Likewise, the Magnolia Board of Education and the Superintendent continue to look at ways of sharing services, especially with other members of the Sterling Interdistrict.

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Dear Neighbors,

I know you are tired of hearing the word "snow", and we all hope there is no more, but I want to make a few statements. During the recent snow storms there have been many who have assisted in helping make the impact less stressful and easier to deal with. Our Public Works Department worked continuously plowing and dumping several tons of salt. Our emergency personnel, including the police, fire and ambulance departments continued to answer calls. Volunteer firemen slept at the fire hall to be ready for any fire call and to escort the ambulance crews when they responded. The firemen also dug out fire hydrants so they would be ready for an emergency.

I want to thank Magnolia Public School and Sterling High School who after being notified by the Police, utilized their automated phone systems to inform homes of students to remove their vehicles from the streets in order to make the plowing easier and more efficient. All of Magnolia came together during the worst snow storm in history. In the future I do want to remind residents that there is an ordinance which requires all vehicles be removed from the street. This may require some residents to park on their lawn, or possibly asking another neighbor to share their driveway. I am sure you noticed the difference on how well streets were cleared when the vehicles were removed, versus those streets that still had vehicles in the street. Magnolia also has an ordinance which requires you to clear your sidewalk 24 hours after the snow has stopped falling, and a big "Thank You" to those neighbors that helped other neighbors! To stay informed during these types of emergencies you should sign up for Nixle which utilizes email and text messaging. Please read the article in this newsletter detailing the free service of Nixle. Again, thank you for all your assistance!

Also this year Magnolia will see the following projects: The railroad crossing at Evesham Avenue will be reconstructed after school finishes in June. This has long been an ongoing issue, but with funding from the State, Conrail will be able to complete this crossing. The football field at the Community Center will be rejuvenated to better function for more than one sport's team at a time, and new lighting is being designed which will be more efficient. The 100 block of Jackson Avenue and East Madison Avenue will be reconstructed and repaved.

One last important item, the U.S. Census application will be coming in March. It is a simple 10 question form which will take about 10 minutes to complete. It is very important to us to have everyone return their information. The U.S. Census information assists municipalities with funding. If you have any questions on how to fill it out there will be a U.S. Census rep. here at borough hall from March 19th to April 19th, every Monday & Friday from 11am-4pm, and Wednesdays from 8:30am-1:30pm.

Are smoke alarms hard to install?

How to keep smoke alarms working?

Simply replace the batteries at least once a year. As a rule of thumb when we change our clocks for day light savings remember to change your smoke detector batteries. Keep them clean. Dust and debris can interfere with the operation, so vacuum over and around your smoke alarms regularly.

PROPERTY TAX RELIEF FOR SENIOR CITIZENS, **DISABLED PERSONS AND VETERANS**

Are you aware that there are several property tax programs that may help Seniors, Disabled Persons and Veterans. The Property Tax Reimbursement Program, commonly known as the "Senior Freeze", is available to residents age 65 or older. It is also available for residents receiving Federal Social Security Disability benefits. For more information on this program please call the State of New Jersey at 1-800-882-6597.

There is also a \$250.00 property tax deduction for Senior Citizens and Disabled Persons or for Veterans that you can apply for at the Borough Hall through the Tax Assessor's Office.
