# FINANCE

### Council President Steve Whalen



Let me begin with some good news. Despite another round of cuts in state aid this year, mayor and council members were able to maintain a zero increase in your municipal property taxes. A lot of strategic preparation had gone into the 2010 budget; and with the support of full council we were able to maintain all of the services and support that has made our town a special place to live and raise a

family without any increase. There were increases to the county and local school property tax bill, mostly due to state funding cuts. While we are never pleased with any increases in your property taxes, we did work to minimize the overall impact; and we are hopeful that the Governor's "tool kit" for property tax relief will bring the relief that he says will come to tax payers.

Serious new challenges have created a more complex reality for our town. First, we are long overdue for a property revaluation (assessment), and we are preparing for this statutory obligation. The last revaluation performed in Magnolia was in 1992. We are planning to work with neighboring communities to prepare a joint request for proposal (RFP) to help defray the expensive cost associated with this task. We will keep you updated through our website as to our progress. Second, while we embrace any effort to curb increases in property taxes, the Governor's proposal has several exemptions, so a true 2% cap is not likely. Additionally, the proposal does not consider how municipalities are to maintain street lighting and fire hydrant services with rate hikes above 10%. As it stands, increases beyond 2% will force cuts in other parts of the operating budget. Please be reassured that the mayor and council members will continue to aggressively work to

minimize the affects of any change that threatens the goodness of our community. We welcome your suggestions to the challenges that our town faces, and we invite you to share your ideas at a council meeting.

The Magnolia Police Department would like to remind all residents, now that school is back the curfew hours are 9:00 pm to 6:00 am during (School Nights), and there is no parking in the yellow painted curbs on Camden and Lincoln Ave. All Borough Parks are closed at Dusk and this will be strictly enforced.

- **New Office Hours:** The tax office will be open to 8 pm on the first Wednesday of the following months; November, February, March, May, August & September.

• Vote by Mail has replaced Absentee Voting in the State of New Jersey. It allows a voter to vote without going to the polls on Election Day. You can

#### **FIRE** Fire Chief Gary Riebel

Fire Prevention Night will be held again this year at Sterling High School. Fire companies from Magnolia, Somerdale, HiNella, Stratford and Laurel Springs have joined in this effort. Come out on Thursday evening, October 14th from 7:00-9:00pm.

Just a reminder to test your smoke alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button. If an alarm "chirps," warning the battery is low, replace the battery right away. All smoke alarms should be replaced every ten years. A survey showed that only 12% of people knew that smoke alarms should be replaced when they are ten years old.

Never remove or disable a smoke alarm. In more than half of reported home fires where smoke detectors were present but didn't sound, the batteries were missing or the alarm had been disconnected. As the National Fire Prevention Association's theme states, "Smoke alarms are a sound you can live with."

Did you know there are now smoke alarms with strobes for the deaf or hearing impaired? The strobes, or visible notification appliances, are activated by the sound of the smoke alarm.
