

With a change of season right around the corner, many residents will be doing some spring cleaning. With that in mind, here are some important reminders about borough trash collection:

- Any trash, recycling or newspapers should be placed at your curb before 6:00am on the day of your collection.
 Empty cans should be removed from your curb no later than 7:00pm on trash collection day.
- Any large items like carpet, discarded wood, etc. should be cut and bundled. Those bundles should weigh no more than 50 lbs. and be no more than 4 to 6 feet in length.
- Take time to spray paint your address in white letters on your recycling containers. This way, if they blow away, we can easily return them to the proper owner.
- All household trash should be in plastic or metal containers, weighing no more than 50 lbs. each.
- Private contractors are responsible for disposing of their own waste, and can not put their items curbside.
- Recycling is done through single stream, and allows for glass, plastic and paper to be put in the same receptacle.
- Electronics (including TVs and computers) can be put out with the regular trash, and will be picked up by DPW separately.
- Leaf pick-up will be during the month of April. Please place curbside, and do not use bags to hold the leaves.
- Please do not put any trash in your recycling bucket.



AIM FOR MAXIMIZED RECYCLING



to 6:00am during the weekends and nights when there is no school on the following day. All Parks are closed at Dusk. This ordinance will be strictly enforced.

The Magnolia Police Department would like to remind residents to always lock their homes and vehicles at all times. If any resident is going away or on vacation, please stop into the Magnolia Police Department and submit a house check for your property.

All residents are urged to please continue to assist your Police Department if you see suspicious or criminal activity. Please remember to call 911 for emergencies and (856) 783-4900 (Dispatch Center) for non-emergency calls.

There is a property maintenance ordinance in the Borough. This ordinance states that all properties should be clear of trash, high grass, untrimmed bushes, animal feces, etc. Should this be reported, a violation letter will be sent. If the situation should persist, Public Works will be sent to clean the area, and the homeowner will be billed for the work. The Borough also has an Ordinance requiring all vehicles to have current license plates and registration. They are not to be parked on the lawn, sidewalk or in the backyard.

Daylight-Savings Time. While you are taking a moment to change your clocks, also take a few moments to change the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors. You should also be checking the detectors for cleanliness and to ensure they are less than 10 years old. If they are dusty, take a minute to wipe them off with a damp towel or use the attachment hose on your vacuum to clean off the dust. Units that are over 10 years old should be replaced with brand new units.

Many homes in Magnolia may not have any smoke detectors, not enough smoke detectors, detectors that are too old, or detectors that are not working. We want residents to understand that working smoke detectors are needed in every home on every level (including the basement), as well as outside each sleeping area and inside each bedroom. If a smoke detector is 10 years old or older, it needs to be replaced.

Smoke detectors can mean the difference between life and death in a fire. NFPA statistics show that working smoke detectors cut the chance of dying in a fire nearly in half, but they must be working properly to do so. The association's data shows that many homes have smoke detectors that aren't working because of missing, disconnected or dead batteries. Roughly two-thirds of all home fire deaths result from fires in homes with no smoke detectors or no working smoke detectors.

One home structure fire is reported every 87 seconds and over 400 people die each year from carbon monoxide poisoning. The few extra minutes you take to make sure your detector's batteries are new, and that the units are clean and up to date could help save you or your family in the event of an emergency.

Storm Planning

As spring and summer approach, the Magnolia Office of Emergency Management wishes to remind our residents to be mindful of being prepared for severe storms. Here are some basic tips to think about to make you and your family safer:

- Know what to do before, during, and after severe weather.
- Create a communications plan with your family before severe weather hits.
- Have emergency supplies in place at home, at work, and in the car.
- · Listen to local officials.
- Check your insurance policies to ensure you have enough coverage.
- Evacuate if advised by local authorities.
- Visit Ready.gov for other planning assistance from FEMA.

Emergency Notification System

The Camden County Freeholder Board's Office of Emergency Management (OEM) is now using Swift911 to help keep Camden County residents informed during fires, outages, floods, hurricanes, evacuations, road closures and other emergency events. Swift911 will allow the Board of Freeholders and Magnolia Officials and Public Safety Agencies to quickly alert residents via voice,

and Magnolia Officials and Public Satety Agencies to quickly alert residents via voice, text, fax, email and/or CAP/IPAWS. This system, combined with our other emergency alert methods, is designed to get emergency messages to you the public, quickly and effectively. This does not preclude you from calling 911 if you need emergency information; it simply provides an opportunity for us to disseminate critical information to you if and when the need arises.
